SKIN

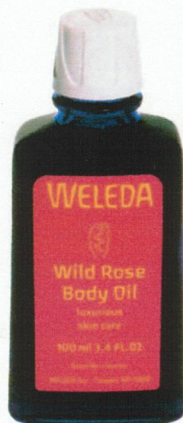


FACE MASK: AESOP

The top-ranked Aesop Chamomile Concentrate Anti-Blemish Masque calms skin and shrinks pores.

BODY OIL: WELEDA

It takes one ton of rose petals to create just a few bottles of Weleda Wild Rose Body Oil, but the hard work pays off. "This relieves dryness and smells like a flower garden," says dermatologist Leslie Baumann, MD, author of *The Skin Type Solution*. "Apply after showering while skin is still damp."



BODY CREAM: REN

The luxurious, lightly scented REN Clean Skincare Damask Rose body cream is packed with nourishing oils and rose petal extracts. "Skin stays soft for hours," says Elisa Tallerico, head of the MTV Studios' makeup department.



FRUM: LILLY

Ready for tired skin? Selling Jurlique is filled with herbs to soothe skin. Bicoastal Greaves saved her subjects' skin with makeup. "It's a great formula," says Chicago hairstylist Kristen Cote-Favaro.

BODY SCRUB: INARA

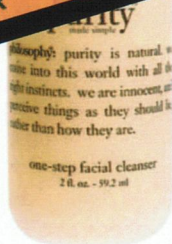
Inara 100% organic Babassu Sugar Rub is a favorite in-shower exfoliant: "It contains antioxidant soybean oil and rosemary leaf extract in addition to babassu nut oil—an excellent emollient," says Colorado dermatologist Catherine Carretero, MD. Denver makeup artist Christine Nottoli hears clients rave about how "clean and polished" their skin looks and feels. "It smooths like nothing else in the world," says Chicago hairstylist Kristen Cote-Favaro.

WASH: PHILOSOPHY

Using for simple face wash. Philosophy cleanses and soothes skin. "It dissolves dirt and makeup without leaving a film. According to New York City dermatologist Debra Jaliman, MD, "It contains sage, chamomile, and carrot infusions that work well on sensitive skin."



HAND CREAM: JURLIQUE

Greaves and fellow makeup artist Lizbeth Williamson carry Jurlique Hand Cream to moisturize after frequent hand washings. Greaves favors the "delicious" rose (at left) while Los Angeles-based Williamson applies lavender. "It's a beautifully rich, nongreasy cream, and the scents relax clients," Williamson says.
